

# Cat Professional and Hill's Pet Nutrition Collaborate to Improve Understanding of FLUTD

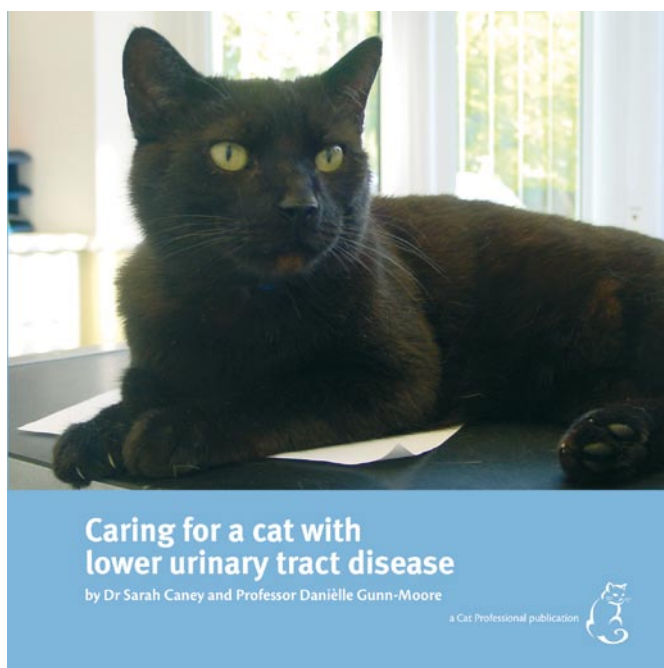
