TTA Bioabsorbable Wetlab

Course Content

Are you ready to move to the next level in cranial cruciate ligament repair or are you hoping to refine your TTA technique?

- TTA involves an osteotomy in the non-weight bearing portion of the tibia (just behind the tibial tuberosity)
- The tibial tuberosity is then advanced to achieve a perpendicular relationship between the tibial plateau slope and patellar tendon
- The advanced tibial tuberosity is secured using titanium screws, a forkless plate and the latest in bioabsorbable implants, creating a stable joint
- Average healing time - 8 weeks

Course Agenda

We will initially focus on the pathophysiology of cranial cruciate ligament disease and the theory that surrounds TTA. There will also be a focus on our unique bioabsorbable cages that fully absorb into the body leaving nothing but natural bone behind. This course has been designed to be highly practical.
